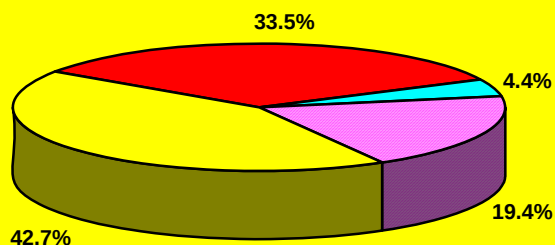

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TRENDS

Since the last 154-Day Direct Primary Report of Registration during a presidential election year (September 30, 2003):

- The total voter registration in the state has increased from 15,437,370 to 15,537,046.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who were eligible to register to vote has declined from 70.68% to 67.77%.
- The percentage number of voters who have declined to state their political party has increased from 16.1% to 19.4%.
- The percentage of people registered with a qualified political party has declined from 83.3% to 80%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party declined from 43.6% to 42.7%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party declined from 35.3% to 33.5%.
- From June 19, 1995 (when the National Voter Registration Act began), through November 30, 2007, 19,517,595 people have registered or reregistered to vote in conjunction with "Motor Voter."
