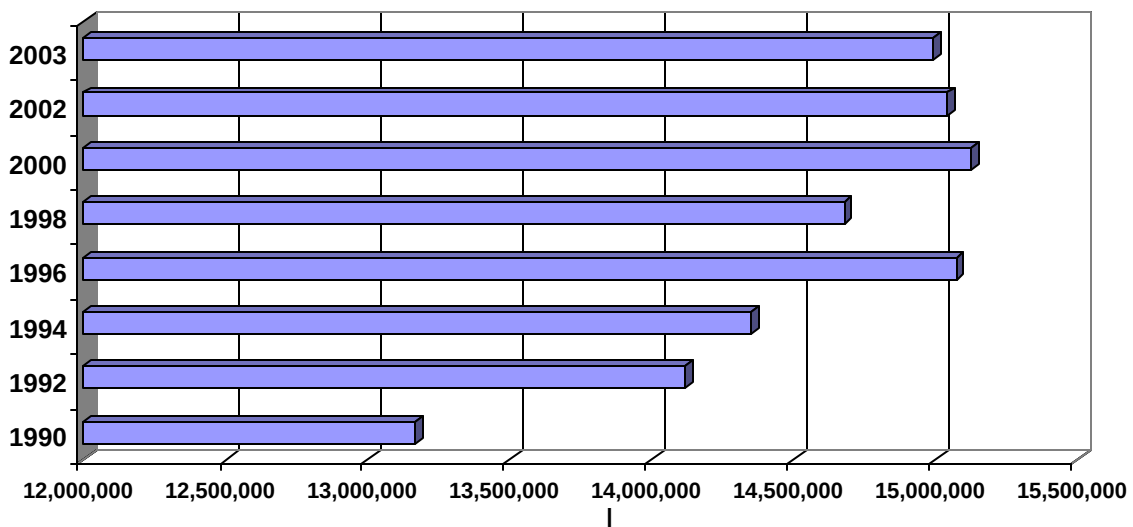

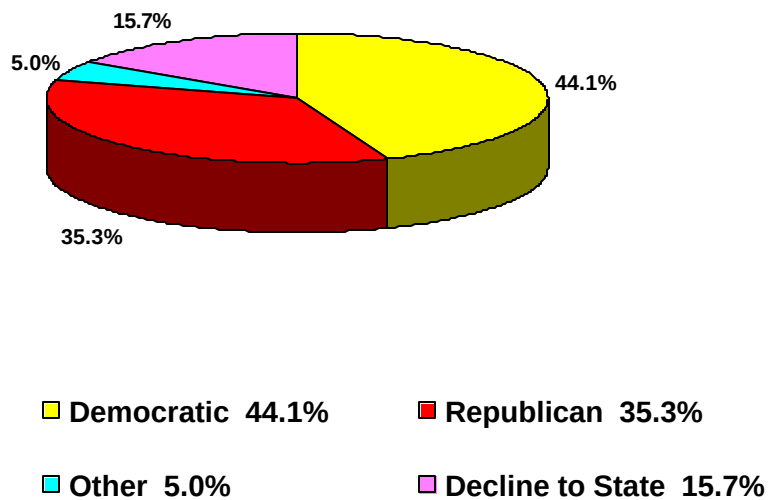

August 8, 2003 Registration Percentages



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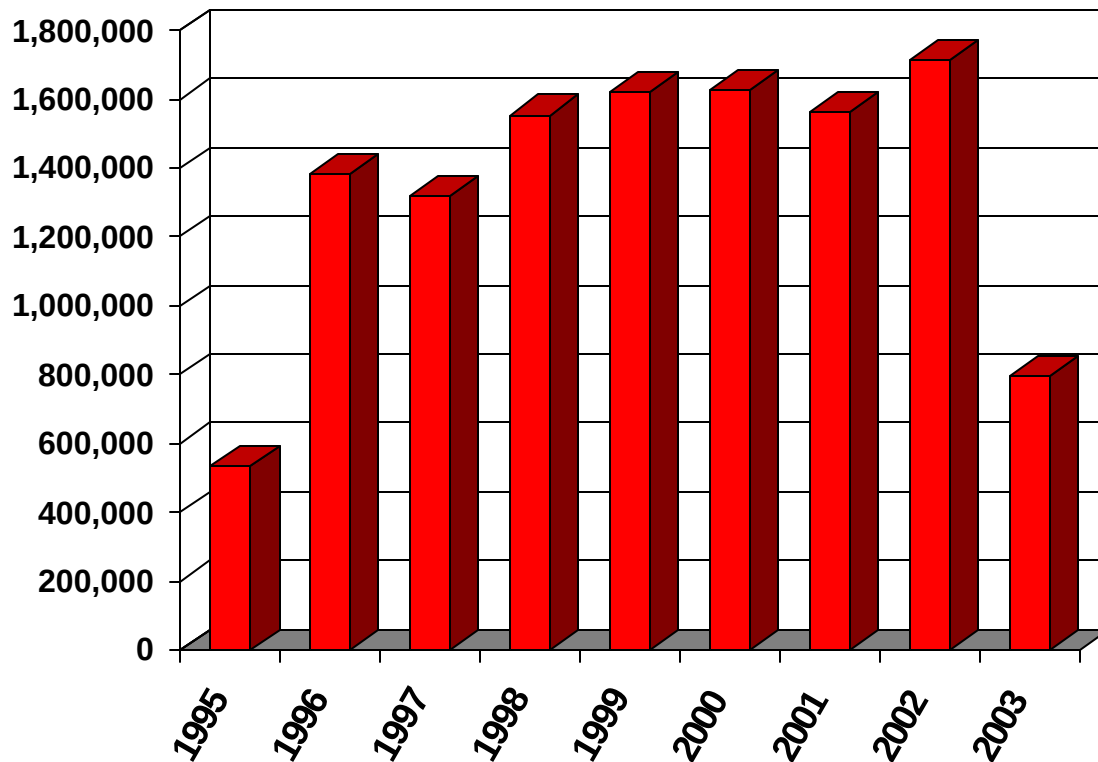

TRENDS:

Since the September 6, 2002 (60-Day) General Election Report of Registration:

- the percentage of total registration in the state has declined from 70.23% to 68.84%;
- registration in the qualified political parties has declined from 84.23% to 83.68%;
- registration in the Democratic party declined from 44.73% to 44.07%;
- registration in the Republican party increased from 35.27% to 35.28%;
- the number of voters who have declined to state has increased from 14.98% to 15.67%; and
- since 6/19/95 (when NVRA began) through June 30, 2003, 12,098,940 people have registered or reregistered in conjunction with "Motor Voter"
